WORLD BOOK DAY 2025: THURSDAY 6TH MARCH 2025

World Book Day will be upon us in no time and reading with your child is one of the best things you can do to help with their development, not to mention building a closer bond with your child. It's a win-win. We will be offering lots of activities on the day but one of the most exciting things we will be offering is a "Make Your Own World Book Day Costume" workshop at Rebecca Cheetham Nursery hosted by Farhana, Mandy and Rohan. If you attended our Christmas Costume session, you will know what to expect. We will provide you with everything that you need; all you need to do is bring your creativity and any materials that have inspired you. We have three dates for you:

Tuesday 25th February 2025 between 9:00am—10:30am and

Wednesday 26th February 2025 between 1:00pm-2:30pm and

Thursday 27th February 2025 between 9:00am—10:30am

We love seeing the children dress up and we will be welcoming book related costumes on the day but please, don't spend money on buying a costume! If you were going to spend money on a costume, we'd rather you spent it on books. We would also love to have parents come in to read books to the children in their home/heritage language on the day. If you don't have any books at all for your child at home, please speak (discretely) to a member of the office team or your child's key worker—we don't want any child to not have books of their own!

FRED (Father's Reading Every Day)

When you sign up to the programme, you are committing read to your child or children for at least 15 minutes a day for the first two weeks and at least 30 minutes for the second two weeks. You will get a reading log to record the number of books read and how much time you spend reading together. This programme is important because it has been shown to improve children's reading and educational achievement. It is also a great way of spending more time with your child and deepening your bond. One dad who took part in FRED said: "Learning is more fun reading with my children. My daughter talks about FRED all the time, she likes to read all kind of books now." We will be launching FRED on Thursday 7th March during our World Book Day celebrations. Look out for the information packs that the team will be handing out to you! Finally, although the programme is called FRED, it is not just for fathers, but for father figures too – this may include grandfathers, brothers, uncles or family friends. READING LIBRARY

Every child in the nursery should have a reading passport. These were given to each child with the child's name on it. For any new starters, if you haven't received one, can you please ask your child's key person or a member of the front office team.

Currently 20 children have utilised this additional service from the nursery and have already been receiving some awards for the books they are borrowing. We would love to double this figure by the end of the month.

When a child has completed 6 stamps they will receive a personalised bookmark.

When a child has completed 12 stamps they will receive a Bronze Certificate and a book for keeps.

When a child has completed 18 stamps they will receive a Silver Certificate.

When a child has completed 24 stamps they will receive a Gold Certificate, a medal and a book for keeps.

PARENT SURVEY 2024/2025



CHANGE OF CLOTHES FOR NURSERY CHILDREN

It is inevitable that children have toileting accidents or get wet from the weather or playing with water. Our aim is to get them changed and dry as quickly as possible. We are finding that lots of children are coming to nursery without a change of clothes or fresh underwear and socks. Even if your child is toilet trained, please make sure that you have some spares in their nursery bag so we can change them quickly and efficiently. We only have limited nursery spares available and we don't want to have children waiting unnecessarily. We also encourage children to have wellington boots to aid in their play—children love jumping in puddles!



TRANSPORT FOR LONDON UPDATE & PARKING—DROPPING OFF & PICKING UP CHILDREN

Our school is proud to hold a gold accreditation for promoting active travel. We encourage staff, children and families to walk, scoot, cycle or use public transport when travelling, having positive benefits for health and reducing pollution in the environment. We are pleased to be working alongside Local Community Police to ensure



that there is safe access to our site and that pollution levels around the school are kept to a minimum. If you are driving to nursery please remember to use the parking bays on Marcus Street and not park your car on the kerb/ yellow lines as this causes an obstruction to both pedestrians and service vehicles. <u>Also the staff car park is strictly for staff only.</u>

Dropping and picking up your children right outside the building with your engine still running is bad for all sorts of reasons. Idling makes for worse air quality and it's young people who are at the greatest risk from the air pollution outside their schools because their lungs are still developing. Children are shorter than adults too, so they are physi-

cally closer to car exhaust pipes. Noise from the vehicle is distracting making it harder for students to hear cars that are actually moving, and which might not be visible behind idling cars.

There's climate change to think about too. When an engine is running, it emits carbon dioxide, the main greenhouse gas responsible for climate change. By switching off your engine when stopped, you stop these emissions too. Now that the days are getting longer and the spring is approaching how about leaving the car at home and walking, scooting, or cycling into school.

We use books to open up a world of learning for our children. The core books we use, relate to children's interests and we feed that through the breadth of activities we offer within the provision. We also think that using books as the basis or our learning helps children love reading on a deeper level which we hope they will keep with them throughout their education.

We are very excited to share another Nathan Bryon and Dapo Adeola picture story book featuring the fabulous Rocket which works perfectly with our theme of sustainability this term, *Clean Up*!
